Proning is the practice of placing a patient in a face-down position to improve oxygenation, especially for those with severe respiratory distress such as Acute Respiratory Distress Syndrome (ARDS). This technique helps expand lung regions, reduce pressure on the lungs, and enhance oxygen delivery, making it a vital



intervention in critical care. Your dedication ensures we are ready to provide the best care possible. Thank you for making this training a success!

## LEAN <u>///</u>

On Wednesday, as part of their November Gemba Walk, our Senior Leadership Team met with staff and physicians in the ICU to learn more about the new Proning skillset which will go live effective December 1st for patients who meet specific criteria.

Proning is a therapeutic intervention for those with Acute Respiratory Distress Syndrome or those who are experiencing severe respiratory failure.

Proning involves the positioning of a patient who is paralyzed, deeply sedated, and on mechanical ventilation in a face down position for 16 hours per day, typically for a period of 48-72 hours. Proning is typically done overnight if possible, so that patients can remain upright for easier access during day time hours.

This type of therapy helps improve oxygenation by redistributing lung perfusion and ventilation, reducing alveolar collapse, decreasing ventilator-induced lung injury and enhancing gas exchange.

Until now, any patients requiring this type of intervention had to be transferred to a hospital in Ottawa.

Proning requires the involvement of the entire multi-disciplinary team, and a lot of logistical planning in order to ensure a safe outcome that can possibly delay or prevent mortality.

This includes a team of six that are required to prone and de-prone and a team of three to reposition the patient's head and arms every two hours while proned.

Noting that the biggest risk to patients who are proned are pressure injuries, it was shared that physiotherapists and occupational therapists have a large role to play in mitigating injury.

It was also noted that, in addition to the key role of nurses and Allied Health professionals in these situations, members of the Pharmacy team and registered dietitians also have important roles to play.

The team thanked the SLT for their support in being able to upstaff so that this skillset could be introduced enabling patients to receive this care close to home.



### In Case You Missed It - Highlights From Sabine's Messages

As I was sharing with our Management team November 13th, there has been a visible increase in the amount of media coverage focused on those in the hospital sector who are facing significant deficits in the current fiscal year and, as a result, are facing service cutbacks and layoff potential.

I want to reassure all of you that our hospital, thankfully, is not in this position

While we are in a good position financial this year, we still need to be cautious with our spending and find ways to be fiscally responsible.



I also attended a meeting in Toronto November 7th for medium sized hospitals like ours and, in addition to the financial challenges, I can tell you that most are struggling with many of the same issues. While I don't want this to be a message of doom and gloom, this is the reality and we all need to do our best to continue providing high quality care in the most efficient and effective ways possible.

### CHEO CEO Celebrates Surgical Partnership With PRH

On November 14th we welcomed in CHEO President and CEO Dr. Vera Etches who was on hand to personally thank members of our Surgical team for their hospitality and the great partnership that has been formed between team and ours in order to bring pediatric surgery closer to home for local patients.

She expressed how important it is to families in our area to be able to receive the same level of care and compassion without the added drive to Ottawa and said that her team has appreciated how friendly and welcoming the environment has been since the partnership was initiated.

In fact, CHEO is actively seeking other ways to partner with outlying hospitals beyond surgical capacities and we are excited to see how we might be able to be a part of this as well going forward.

### Operation Of Complex Continuing Care Beds Will Return To PRH In 2026

Speaking of great partnerships, you may or may not be aware that, for many years, Marianhill has housed and provided care for those of our patients who require admission to Complex Continuing Care beds. This includes patients who no longer have significant acute care medical needs but are still medically complex and could require care for up to 90 days on average versus being discharged to home.

Now, in light of Marianhill's redevelopment and our ability to do so, we are making plans to take back our eight Complex Continuing Care beds and co-locate them on Medical 2A with other Medical patients effective April 1st, 2026.

We are currently in the process of developing a plan to do this that includes staffing patterns and other aspects of care that will be required in order to meet the needs of these patients. You can anticipate hearing some updates on this in the coming months.

### MP Cheryl Gallant Visits PRH

We've been hosting a number of visitors and delegations lately including a November 12th meeting with Algonquin-Renfrew-Pembroke Member of Parliament (MP) Cheryl Gallant. Cheryl was interested in learning more about our hospital's emergency preparedness protocols and, as part of the visit, I invited her to tour the hospital. She was impressed with the size and scope of services we are providing at PRH and thanked us for the care we are providing for the community.

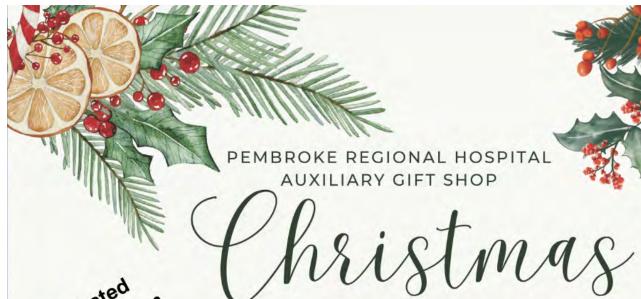

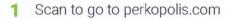
