SUBJECT: Work Self-Isolation for Asymptomatic Healthcare

Workers (HCWs) with Sick Household Contacts

**Pending Test Results** 

In alignment with the Champlain Region, and to better assist us in ensuring we have adequate numbers of HCWs to deliver essential clinical services while minimizing COVID-19 institutional risk, we will be working with asymptomatic HCWs identified as a household contact to reduce work schedule interruptions.

Asymptomatic HCWs who are a household contact of someone with COVID-19 compatible symptoms will be able to continue to work under "work self-isolation" pending the receipt of the results of testing on the household contact.

This may be modified if community transmission increases significantly as the COVID-19 risk/benefit ratio to institution would change. Any modifications to this will be done in collaboration with Renfrew County Public Health.

## Procedure:

**1.** If a HCW fails COVID-19 screening due to a household contact having symptoms compatible with COVID-19

and a. The HCW is and remains asymptomatic

and b. The household contact is NOT a known contact of a case of COVID-19

- 2. The HCW notifies the institution's Occupational Health and Safety office (extension 8200)
- 3. The household contact is being tested for COVID-19
- **4.** During the time when the test result of the household contact is pending, the HCW may work in 'Work self-isolation'
- **5.** If the result of the COVID-19 test on the household contact is negative AND the HCW remains asymptomatic then he/she may return to work as per normal without restrictions
- **6.** If the result of the COVID-19 test on the household contact is positive then the HCW is directed to contact public health, isolate at home and not return to work

## What you need to know if you are in "work self-isolation":

While at work, the HCW should:

- Take temperature twice a day (you will be given a tracking form that will need to be completed)
- Travel to and from work in private vehicle or wear a surgical/procedure mask in public transit
- Adhere to universal masking recommendations at all times on the property, maintain physical distancing (remaining greater than 2m/6ft from others) except when providing direct care, and perform meticulous hand hygiene
- Not eat meals or take breaks in shared space with other HCWs
- Not work in multiple locations

Outside of work, the HCW should be in self-isolation and travel directly to and from work.
